Career Notes: Incentivizing Employee Success in Surveying Firms

When Jennifer Marks, LS, became a licensed surveyor and joined BL Companies 25 years ago, she was only the eighth hire. Now, the Meriden, Conn.-based, architecture, engineering, environmental and land surveying firm employs 250 people. Marks, who serves as executive director of survey services for the company, has worked her way up and watched the business grow to include 13 locations across the Northeast and Texas. She is licensed in nine states and she calls BL Companies a one-stop shop for land development, public infrastructure and energy consulting needs. The surveying division is very active in energy, including substations, electric transmission lines and underground distribution lines. Marks says the Connecticut Department of Transportation is one of the company's largest clients and that her team mainly takes on largescale projects — not residential.

Marks worked for several other smaller and mid-sized companies after graduating from Boston University with a bachelor's degree in geology and a minor in cartography. One thing she admires about BL Companies is that it is employee owned. "So everybody has skin in the game to make our company successful. That's why we take leadership development very seriously and we feel everybody at the company contributes in some way toward leadership in their daily interactions," she says.

The business offers a leadership development program to employees, which Marks views as an effective way to foster healthy employee interaction, and respectful internal and external conduct. She also takes professional development very seriously. With respect to the surveying profession, she highlights two levels: the four-year degree requirement and apprenticeships. She recognizes that a shortage of individuals are becoming licensed surveyors and thinks opening up more pathways to the profession could be helpful.

Marks values higher education, pointing out that so much can be learned about critical thinking, problem solving and writing. At the same time, she views surveying as, historically, an apprenticeship profession. One idea she shares is making higher education a requirement for those who want to rise up to business management as a surveyor and opening up apprenticeship as a pathway for those who may want to focus on fieldwork and/or CAD work, for example, and may not be interested in entrepreneurship, and contract and proposal writing. "I'm a proponent of a four-year degree, but it can't be exclusive. We need to have pathways for others," Marks says.

Another topic she has spent a lot of time thinking about is professional development, which she is a proponent of. The problem she sees with professional development is that, in many cases, the topics are limited. She offers up an example of a technician wanting to take a Microsoft Excel course, suggesting that it count as professional development. "I would just like a wider range of topics acceptable," she says. "Many states say it has to be a boundary course or it has to be a survey technology course, versus contract writing, risk management, leadership development; a wider, broader range of topics that could fulfill your professional development credits."

POB: What path did you take to end up where you are today?

MARKS: It was a little per chance. I was a geology major. I didn't have a job when I got out of school. I went to Wisconsin because my husband-to-be was in grad school out there. I just went out looking for a job one day and ended up finding a surveying company that offered me a job that day. I took the job and when it started to get slow went out with the surveyors and really loved it. My love of the outdoors, map capabilities, combining history and then the mapmaking; fitting all these pieces together was something I

really enjoyed and I just stuck with it ever since then.

POB: What did you want to accomplish when you were first getting started?

MARKS: After learning the profession and all the pieces that go with it, I did know very early on that I would want to get licensed. Also, when I started, CAD was just coming into the profession and I wanted to get involved in the electronic drawings and computer end of things. When I first started it was all hand drafting.

POB: Which of those accomplishments have you achieved at this point?

MARKS: Throughout my career I've been very hands on in staying up with the technology. Today I don't sit here and produce CAD plans. I still have working knowledge and can get in and do things. So I do believe staying up with the technology has been important. I'm at a bigger company now so I have lots of people who are really knee deep in the technology and I'm more trying to run the business of it and hoping we're making some money to fuel our employee ownership here at BL.

POB: What have you done that wasn't on that list or may be a bit unexpected given where you thought you would go?

Most recently, I'm very involved with CREW (commercial real estate women) and I was the president of that last year. So branching out into the industry and promoting women, not only surveyors, in a larger role within real estate, construction, infrastructure and all of that. Equipment Thefts - Suggestions that may help

Rick Pryce has been a stalwart in the battle for protecting surveying equipment from theft, and survey crew members from harm. Below are some suggestions from Rick:

- Have your crews take special precautions now, when they leave your offices, looking for anyone following them.
- When you get to the job sites, (especially those you've been to on multiple days), take notice of every vehicle and look for people watching you and your staff.
- Lock away equipment not in use, in steel cases, barred cages, or cabled together and tied to truck beds.
- Do not be more than two steps away from your instruments at any time, and pay attention to your surroundings when set up, looking for suspicious people or vehicles.
- If you notice suspicious vehicles, start taking pictures of them and the license tags, maybe you can scare them off, so they look for an easier target.
- If you do get hit, please contact the CALS office with the location and any details so we can alert others quickly.
- Make out a theft report so we can get it into the crime database.

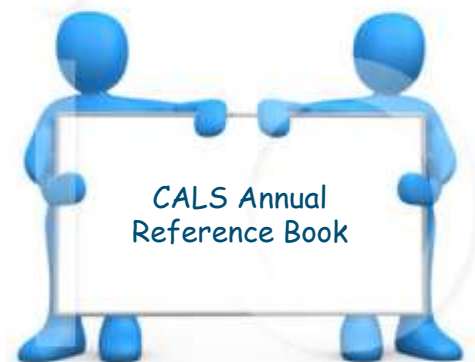
This year marks the 50th anniversary since CALS was formed.

FEMA, NFIP & Flood Insurance Mapping Reform

The statutory authority for the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will expire on September 30, 2017. NFIP remains \$24 billion in debt to U.S. taxpayers and hasn't repaid any principal on its loans since 2010. Congress passed the Biggert-Waters Act in 2012 and the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act in 2014 to begin NFIP reform. Further legislation is needed in the next reauthorization to improve the surveying and mapping data needed to provide more accuracy and solvency in the program and fairer premiums for homeowners.

Flood maps identify areas at greatest risk of flooding and provide the foundation for NFIP. Accurate geospatial information is essential to all aspects of flood insurance risk assessment and emergency management (preparedness, prevention, protection, detection, response, recovery). Imagery, map data and other geospatial assets are of most critical value in emergency response during the initial hours and days immediately before and following a hurricane, flood or other disaster. These data can be an effective, efficient and a life-saving tool. In addition, accurate geospatial data facilitates the engineering analysis to perform risk identification and risk assessment. To further improve the nation's flood insurance program, protect homeowners, and help reduce the taxpayers' financial risk, MAPPS and NSPS recommend a number of surveying and mapping (geospatial) reforms –



- Given that elevation data from USGS for flood maps is on average 35 years old, the USGS 3D Elevation program (3DEP) should be designated as the inter-agency, intergovernmental funding pool to collect and maintain elevation data for flood maps and a variety of other national priority applications. Dedicated funding will enable USGS, FEMA and other cooperators to keep elevation map data current on an 8-year repeat cycle. For more information on 3DEP see the e-book at: www.3dep4america.com.

- Create a National Structure Inventory to aid in flood mapping and engineering, as well as benefit FEMA, first responders and other related agencies providing reliable, accurate data to streamline structure, infrastructure and safety assessments, including response and recovery time, as well as accurate pre and post disaster structure risk assessment and assessment values; simplify the sale, rating and processing of flood insurance; create a cost effective, efficient and accurate structure and infrastructure inventory providing our nation a single platform of flood mapping assessments and inventory.

- Include address and parcel data to permit the integration of address information with structure/parcel information in flood insurance processing and emergency response; to enhance data available for insurance rating; to permit first responders' access to data for life saving activities in a declared emergency.

- Strengthen the USGS National Streamflow Information Program. The USGS streamflow network is critical to the NFIP and flood risk mapping and assessment. Maintaining a dense network operational, updating the hardware, reactivating critical gaging stations, and increasing the geospatial real-time data feeds, should all be supported in the framework of the NFIP reauthorization.

- FEMA should assure maps are compliant with the NGS National Spatial Reference System 2022; establish national, geo-enabled, web access to maps, similar to North Carolina (<http://fris.nc.gov/fris/>); and assure that qualifications based selection (QBS) contracting be utilized for all surveying and mapping services.

ACTION REQUESTED:

MAPPS and NSPS respectfully urge members of Congress to sponsor/cosponsor legislation making technical reforms to the flood maps. Representatives are asked to cosponsor the bill to be introduced by Rep. Mooney of West Virginia. To cosponsor, contact Brian Chatwin of Rep. Mooney's office at 5-2711. 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
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
