This is my forth attempt at writing you to express our thanks for the time and thoughtfulness of John Wagenblatt, LS, one of the members of CALS. Unfortunately, my previous attempts never did seem to capture how thankful we are here at Paul Smith's College for John's dedication to the students and the industry; so I'm attempting this once again. John is a principal of the LRC group in Connecticut, an alum of Paul Smith's College, and a very valued member of the PSC Surveying Technology Program's board of advisors. We are a small school with a two-year surveying program, and have a limited budget. As a result, purchasing the newest types of equipment now emerging into the surveying field-is not feasible. To ensure our students are exposed to this equipment, we have come to rely on guest speakers demoing their equipment for the students here at the college.

We have had simple scanning demos before from other guests, where the speaker set the equipment up to scan the room the presentation is in, and then show students the resulting raw data. However, during the freshmen's required summer session this summer, John donated two weekdays of his own time, and that of one of his employees to demonstrate a laser scanning system to our students.

This is not to denigrate our previous speakers; they've all done excellent jobs with their presentations and provided the students the knowledge they need at this point in their careers. The visit from John and his employee, though, was beyond anything we have had to date. John and Ryker Nolan (the employee that assisted him) arrived here at the college in northern New York by 8:30am, having left Connecticut very early that morning. He spent part of the morning explaining the process to the students and for the next several hours he and Riker, along with our students scanned the library, inside and out, then closed out the day processing the collected data. The next morning John and Riker presented the processed data to the students, along with several members of our faculty and administration. After leaving, John and Ryker further processed the data they collected during their visit and made it available to our program to use in classes here at PSC

We are obviously indebted to those in the industry that provide these opportunities for our students.






